- I am calling to ask Representative Walden to vote "No" to repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The ACA has helped to ensure 95 percent of all Oregonians have affordable health insurance. 55 percent of children under 18, and 29 percent of all residents in Rep. Walden's district are covered by Medicaid. If the ACA is repealed, many of those people will lose coverage.
- I am calling to ask Representative Walden to vote "No" to repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Losing the ACA will jeopardize funding for children's immunizations, teen suicide prevention, and essential public health care services. Oregon will also lose over 40,000 needed jobs. Repealing ACA is bad or Oregonians' health and our state's economy.
- I am calling to ask Representative Walden to vote "No" to repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Rural communities will be hit hardest by the loss of the Affordable Care Act. More of our residents depend on subsidized health care coverage. Rural hospitals will be especially burdened with people seeking primary health care in the emergency room. We cannot afford to lose the ACA.
- I am calling to ask Representative Walden to vote "No" to repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Medicaid and Healthy Kids (CHIP) cover 406,000 children in our communities including: 85 percent of children living in poverty, 47 percent of children ages $0-5,44$ percent of children with disabilities or special health care needs, and 100 percent of children in foster care. Significant changes to Medicaid proposed in the replacement for ACA like limiting coverage of preventive screenings and costly follow-up care would have huge, negative ripple effects for coverage.
- I am calling to ask Representative Walden to vote "No" to repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The replacement plan would likely take away health coverage for more than 375,000 Oregonians. That is more people than live in Eugene, Bend, Medford, and Grants Pass, combined.
